


Educational Visit at Appin Technology Labs for B.Com & BCA Students

2. Objectives of the Practice

Legal Aid Clinics basically serve the purpose of providing legal advice not for the aim of earning profit but in General Public Interest. In law schools, though knowledge of law is thoroughly imparted. However theoretical knowledge is not sufficient when its applicability is not known. Students pursuing law have zeal and enthusiasm to provide legal services. Legal aid clinics thus serve the two-fold purpose, the first that they provide free legal services to economically weaker people and second, they direct the energies of the students of law in contributing to the society.

3. The Context

The legal aid camps are conducted by the law department. The law students are headed by their teachers. 
